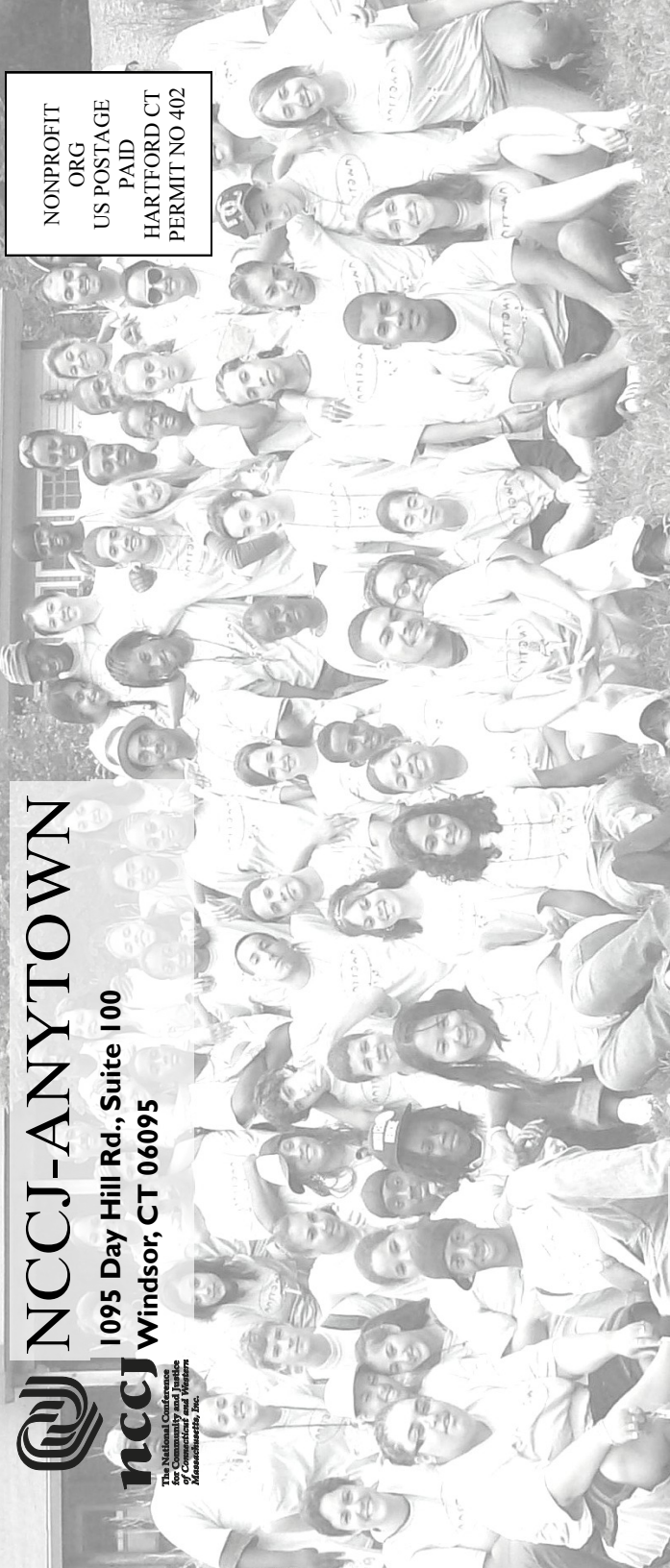
NCCJ Programs Include:

BRIDGES: A 2-day diversity, leadership, and prejudice-reduction program for middle and high school students. During BRIDGES a group of 25 diverse students and faculty explore the feelings, attitudes, and experiences we have about people of different backgrounds and identities (racial, gender, ethnic, faith). The participants leave BRIDGES with a deeper understanding of how prejudice and bias affect our life and how we as individuals and as a collective can work to combat it to make our communities more just, accepting, and inclusive.

ANYTOWN Youth Action Coalition (YAC): A group that takes a youth centered approach to creating positive change in our communities and schools. YAC is made up of ANYTOWN Alumni who learn to work together to fight bias and bigotry through action projects idealized at ANYTOWN.

Community ConversationsSM: A community-based program for democratic dialogue on race relations. Since 1998, over 5,000 individuals of diverse backgrounds have participated in these 6 week dialogue sessions designed to increase awareness of racial, ethnic and cultural divides and empower participants to take action to improve race relations.

Workplace Diversity Programs: A custom designed organizational development programs facilitated by trained NCCJ staff. These workshops address a variety of social justice issues and guide participants toward the development of positive and supportive workplace environments.

What is ANYTOWN?

Camp ANYTOWN is a nationally recognized and award winning diversity, leadership, and social justice program for youth ages 15-18. Founded in 1957, ANYTOWN is designed to educate, liberate, and empower youth participants (delegates) to become effective, responsible leaders and community builders. For six days, a diverse group of 60 high school students come together to build a community based on respect, understanding, and inclusivity.

Through engaging games, workshops, and discussions, Delegates along with 25 staff members explore the thoughts, opinions and experiences we all share on topics like bias, bigotry, oppression, and social change. Through this dialogue, the Delegates are taken on a journey to create a model for an ideal community in which members move beyond tolerating each others differences to celebrating them. It is the goal of ANYTOWN to equip the Delegates with the knowledge and skills to transform their home communities into places where individual differences are seen as positive tools that bring people together instead of keeping them apart.



Where is ANYTOWN?

ANYTOWN is held on the beautiful campus of Saint Joseph College in West Hartford, CT. Participants are bunked in the college's new apartment-suites and transportation is provided from Western Massachusetts and Connecticut. For more information about Saint Joseph College please log onto:

Who Should Apply?

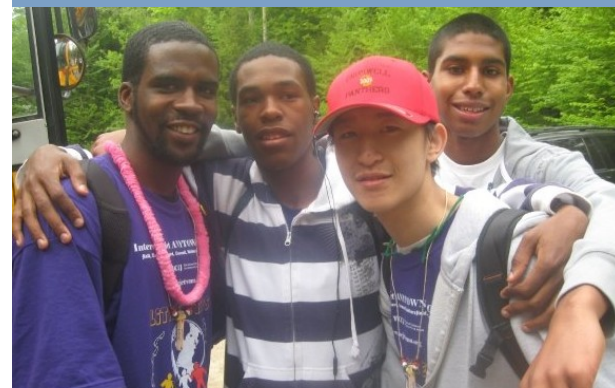
- Youth age 15 to 18 currently living in Connecticut or Western Massachusetts.

How much does it Cost?

The cost of ANYTOWN is \$500. There is a \$25.00 registration fee that will be applied to the \$500 tuition. While the full cost of ANYTOWN is \$1,500 per delegate, the NCCJ covers much of the cost through grant funding and other contributions.
